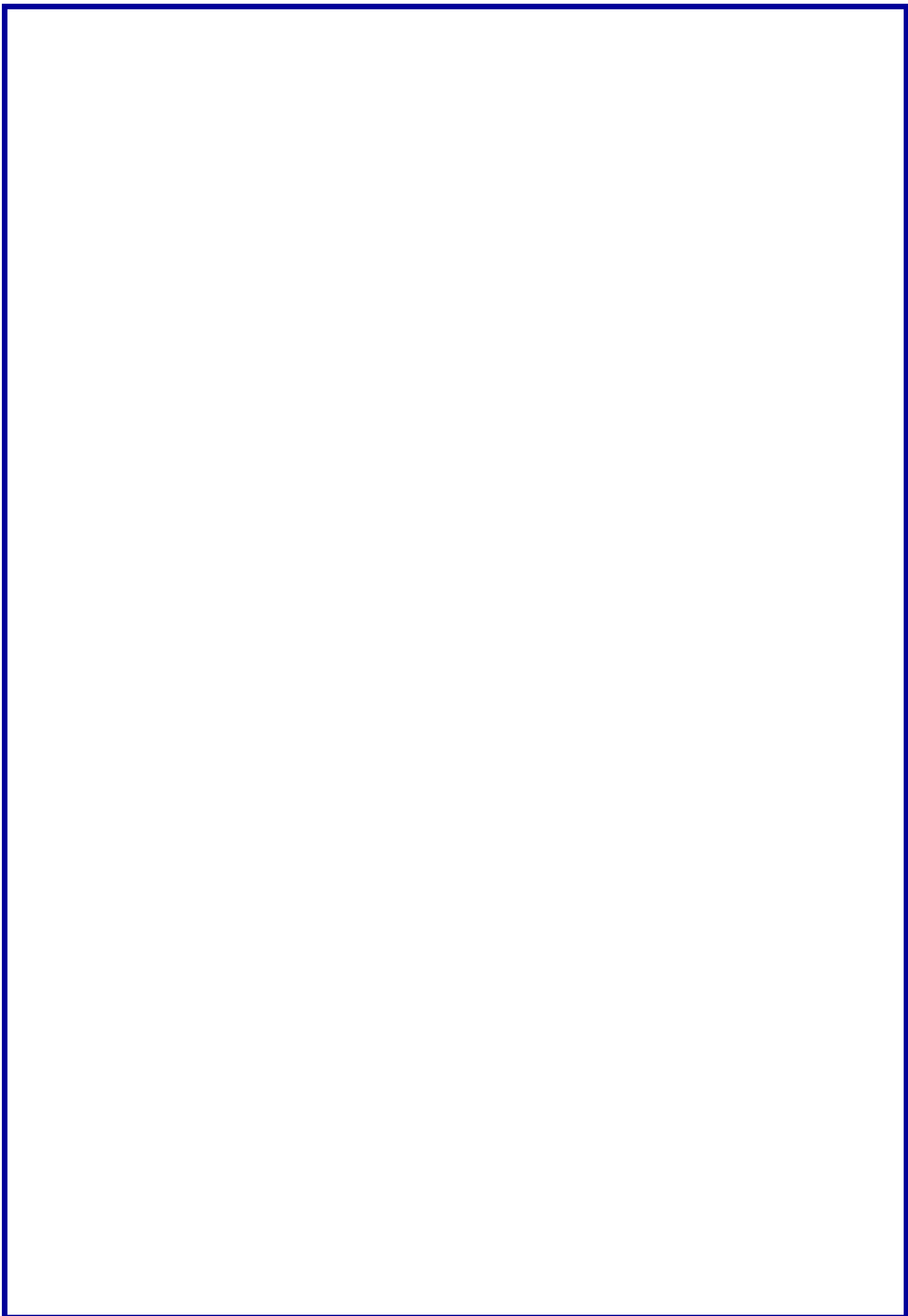

Symptoms can appear in any order. Some may not appear at all. Early symptoms can include:

fever headache vomiting diarrhoea
muscle pain stomach cramps
fever with cold hands and feet
